

## **NEW GENERATIONS SERVICE EXCHANGES**

## **ELIGIBILITY**

New Generations exchanges are open to students and young professionals ages 18-25. To qualify, applicants should be open-minded individuals who have demonstrated leadership in their community, and are willing to. Candidates should also possess qualities such as flexibility and a willingness to try new things that will enable them to fully experience life in another country and become excellent cultural ambassadors. All applicants must

be sponsored by a local Rotary club and complete a written application and in-person interview.



The NGSE program is completely administered by volunteer Rotary club

members, keeping program expenses low. The District 6930 application fee is \$500 which covers fees and travel insurance (medical, accident and illness.) \$450 is refunded if a match is not made.

Participants are expected to cover the following expenses:

- Round-trip airfare
- All travel documents, such as passports and visas (if necessary.)
- Spending money and ancillary travel


Rotary NGS Exchanges are administered locally, and all applicants must be sponsored by a local Rotary club
